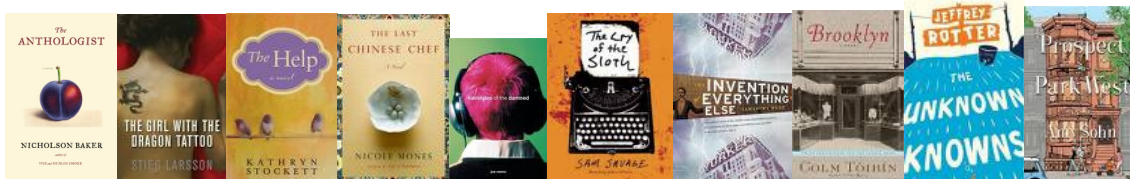


Saint Ann's Library
