Position Responsibilities

Teach Chinese language, literature and culture to students in middle school. Design individualized lesson plans where appropriate and evaluate on a regular basis whether students are in the right class and at the right level for their abilities. Instruct students in a flexible, creative environment. Employ various instructional strategies based on the needs of students to teach with energy and originality. Prepare course objectives and outlines for the course of study following curriculum guidelines and the school and state requirements. Coordinate with a team of other teachers to design curricula and lessons responsive to the needs of the students in particular classes. Assign lessons and correct homework in a timely manner. Analyze and evaluate student performance. Write detailed narrative reports on each student's progress twice a year, including specific information about each student's performance and growth in spoken and written Chinese. Participate in parent conferences and meet with parents to discuss student progress and problems, including discussing a student's work with clarity and nuance. Navigate and address parental criticism. Attend follow up meetings with Division Heads, the Department Chair, Tutors or others to discuss and address curriculum effectiveness and student performance. Participate in faculty meetings.

- Completion of 1 graduate level credit in Pedagogical Issues in Teaching Chinese as a Second Language

- Fluency in spoken and written Chinese and English
