

POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT: FRENCH TEACHER Full time or Part time

Saint Ann's School, an independent, non-sectarian day school, is seeking a part-time or full-time French Teacher. We seek a passionate, inspiring, and experienced linguist with native or near-native fluency in French who works well with children across a range of ages. Our Romance Languages department teaches seventh through twelfth grades, and, whether teaching a class of beginners or advanced language students, teachers need to be in complete command of their subject. All of our French students expect to have a teacher who knows and loves French and can share their passion with them. Typically, students begin their modern foreign language study in the seventh grade, and by the eleventh and twelfth grades many are ready for advanced composition and literature classes. Working under curricular guidelines and—in beginning and intermediate French classes—with recommended textbooks, teachers are expected to design their own courses. There is much support from the Department Chair, colleagues, and written resources for this creatively demanding task, but the teacher will not be told what to do. The teacher is the artist and he/she will decide how to enliven the subject.

Teachers at Saint Ann's must be committed to working with students from a wide variety of backgrounds, meeting the individual needs of students, and investing in the School's ongoing work around issues of diversity, equity, and inclusion.

We do not give grades. Instead, twice a year, teachers write full-page reports on each student's progress. Reports are a holistic description of a student's work over the course of the semester and include anecdotes, descriptions of a child's progress with a particular skill, and the development of their understanding of the subject material. Report writing is intrinsic to how we understand our students, and teachers find it more rewarding and satisfying than giving grades.
